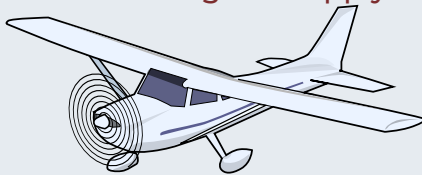

- A recommendation letter from an instructor or advisor (optional)

Eligibility Requirements:

- Applicant must be a U.S. Citizen or a legal US resident.
- Must be at least 16 years of age
- Eligible candidates must be currently working on flight ratings and/or be enrolled in an academic flight-training or aviation maintenance program located at E16 or RHV.
- Previous qualifying scholarship applicants who were not selected in previous years are encouraged to apply

Interested applicants must fill out the application form and submit a one-page essay or two-minute multimedia presentation. The essay/presentation will help the scholarship committee gain a better understanding about the applicant.

We like students to share a bit about themselves and their aviation experience: how they got started in aviation, why they love flying, what their aviation goals are, where they are in their flight training, and how the scholarship would help.

We are also interested to know about any clubs, philanthropy, community service, etc (aviation or not) that the applicant is involved with.

Letters of recommendation are not mandatory. The letter can be from a Certified Flight Instructor, teacher, professor, advisor, or mentor.
